Volunteers

Vacaville Ice Sports and the entire figure skating community rely heavily on volunteers to help provide skaters in our community with a high-quality skating experience. Each year, hundreds of parents, coaches and even skaters volunteer time to enhance skaters' experiences at competitions, shows and more. Time commitment

Volunteers are scheduled in 1-hour shifts, and you can volunteer for as many as you prefer! Please consider volunteering for at least one shift as your assistance greatly impacts the experience each skater has.

Will I receive any volunteer training?

Being a volunteer at an ice-skating competition or event is incredibly easy, but we understand that it can be intimidating without proper information and training. Because of that we will be sure to have documents laid out, explaining the steps to accomplish the job. You can also ask the Skating Director or any coach or employee of Vacaville Ice.

Competition Eligibility

Open to all skaters who are registered individual members of ISI. Skaters must enter at the level of tests passed and registered with the ISI. Events offered to all ages – Tots through Adults.

General Rules

The competition will be conducted in accordance with the guidelines contained in the current ISI Handbook. Skaters may enter more than one event. This showcase event will include Artistic, Interpretive, Rhythmic, Spotlight & All Team Events. Outstanding performances will be invited to compete again in artistic recall for best overall. No technical events offered.

Awards

All skaters will receive an award. Awards will be presented to 1st – 5th place; all other skaters in the group will be considered 6th place. Awards will be presented upon the posting of each individual event. Artistic recall awards will be presented on the ice at the end of the competition.

Music and Registration

All skaters must check in at the registration desk at least one hour prior to their scheduled event. All music must be digitally submitted through EntryEeze, but please have a phone backup on hand. The music deadline is **May 10th 2025, there is a \$25 music late fee**. Music uploads must be done on a computer. Contact your coach if you have issues.

Skaters must check in with the Ice Monitor no later than 5 skaters prior to their event.

Schedule of Events

A schedule of events will be emailed to all participating skaters & coaches & posted at Vacaville Ice Sports and on the Vacaville Ice Sports website www.vacavilleicesports.com no later than 2 weeks prior to the event.

Rink Size & Set-up

Ice surface is 200' by 85' with rounded corners. The curtain is taking up most of the red circles on one side of the ice. Groups of 3 or more will not have a spotlight.

Entry Fees

The entry fee for the first event is \$65 (Tots first event \$40); each additional event for the same competitor is \$35. Partner events are \$32 (per skater). Team, Family and Ensemble are \$25 per skater. Please note that there is an EntryEeze processing fee upon checkout.

Test and Entry Deadline

Saturday, April 26th, 2025

All entries and payments will be conducted via EntryEeze. All entries must be submitted on or before entry deadline. Late entries, if accepted, will be charged a double fee.

Verification

Coaches must verify that all events and levels are correct after the application is submitted. The information submitted on EntryEeze must be accurate.

Events

Artistic Skating

This event is open to Freestyle skaters only. There are no required maneuvers in Artistic Skating, but there are maneuver limitations. Emphasis is on the creative and innovative design of the skating program. Strong edges, body positions, flow, music interpretation, rhythm, choreography and artistry should be the main focus of an Artistic program. There is no grade for technical merit. Props are NOT permitted in this event category.

Interpretive

The emphasis of this event category is on the skater's ability to make-up an original program routine while matching the choreography to the chosen music. This is a fun event to showcase the skater's ability to interpret music and to think while skating. There is no credit given for the difficulty of the maneuvers performed. Skaters are not allowed to receive communication from instructors, parents, friends, skaters, or anyone else during this event. Skaters will listen to the music 4 times; twice off the ice and twice on the ice. Details about where to meet and what time will be at the registration desk.

Spotlight Light Entertainment

To entertain in a refreshing, lighthearted vaudeville type fashion using music, costumes, props, comedy, dance and skating moves.

Spotlight Dramatic

An artistic theatrical performance by an individual skater that evokes an emotional response from the judges and the audience. The skater's interpretation should create a mood that is enhanced by style, creativity, costume and props. The overall impression is dramatic, not lighthearted as in the light entertainment category.

Spotlight Character

Individual skaters portray a famous, easily identifiable character, using music, costume, props and actions.

Couples Spotlight

Two skaters (either related or not) perform a routine together that is entertaining, emotional or a portrayal of characters using music, costumes and props (optional). One program can only be entered into one category (you cannot use the same program for multiple categories). The couples spotlight level is based on the highest ISI test passed by either skater.

Family Spotlight

This event is open to 2 or more family members only (of any age and skating level). Routines may be fun, entertaining, emotional or portrayals of characters using music, costumes and props. Skaters will be judged on the entertainment and performance value of the program. Elaborate costumes and props are encouraged to help illustrate the act; however, not every number needs a prop for effectiveness or to complete the mood. All routines are limited to 1:30 duration.

Rhythmic Skating

Rhythmic Skating events are open to all freestyle level skaters. It requires the use of one handheld prop: ball, hoop or ribbon. The program should contain elements that employee the use of the prop throughout the routine. The skater must always maintain control of the prop. If two rhythmic events are entered at the same competition, the skater must use two different programs and different props. The same rule and choreography limitations apply as for spotlight events. **Props are not allowed in the warm-up.**

Prop Specifications

Ball: Made of rubber or plastic with a diameter of 7.75 inches

Hoop: Made of wood or plastic, but must be made from rigid, non-bending material. The hoop diameter should be between 2 feet 7 inches and 2 feet 11 inches.

Ribbon: The ribbon stick should be made of wood, plastic or fiberglass. Stick should be between 20'' - 30''. Ribbon material should be one single piece of satin or non-starched fabric. Ribbon width should be 2'' - 4'' and length should be between 6 feet and 9 feet.

Team Events

All other team events will be offered in this competition. Please refer to the ISI handbook for all available team events and their rules.

Practice Sessions

Public skating and Freestyle sessions will be available the week leading up to the competition. Please check the events calendar at VacavilleIceSports.com for specific session times. Music may not be played during public sessions, and permitted jumps and spins are limited. There are no maneuver or music restrictions on Freestyle sessions.
